#### About Us

Chesterfield Community Care Farm works a 23 acre site at Lower Pilsley, near Chesterfield.

We offer a range of supportive and inclusive activities for all people with learning, physical disabilities and emotional behavioural difficulties. You would be working as part of a team caring for our livestock and land.

We are a Not For Profit Social Enterprise working to benefit all the community.



### **Activities on Offer**

Animal Care - including Pigs, Rabbits, Goats, Chickens, Geese, Guinea pigs, Cattle, Sheep and more. Horticulture - Growing vegetables, Fruit and Flowers, Maintaining Fences and Hedges. General Construction.

We are constantly developing new activities, our future plans include:

- · Establishing a farm shop
- A veg box service
- Making garden furniture and other timber items
- Bee keeping and producing honey.

The Farm provides a specialist programme that helps people to overcome the barriers preventing them from engaging in mainstream society. The programme aims to raise attainment levels, encourage learning and achievement and personal, social skills. The ultimate purpose of the programme is to enable people to develop the essential skills needed to flourish in life.



### **Land Based Studies**

Service users have the opportunity to gain real life work experience such as care of livestock, horticulture and land maintenance, gaining level 1 & 2 qualifications on our 23 acre site. The Farm provides suitable programmes for service users with Special Educational Needs. All qualifications are provided by Excell For Training Limited.

If this is something you are interested in, we offer FREE taster sessions.

#### **Functional Skills**

We can provide support to develop English and Maths skills. All service users will be assessed to identify their preferred learning style and our programmes will be delivered accordingly.



#### Personal and Social Development

As part of the programme, service users take part in activities to encourage personal and social development skills, such as:

- Teamwork
- Communication
- Motivation
- Understanding of difference
- Confidence

Engagement in the programme will enable service users to gain the necessary skills, employability qualifications and confidence.

#### General Construction

There are also opportunities to take part in activities such as:

- General maintenance of onsite facilities.
- Carpentry
- Construction of Animal Enclosures
- Maintaining Animal Enclosures
- Fencing
- Constructing Timber Products
